A Note from Our Executive Director

None of us could have foreseen that in March 2020, the world would be gripped by a global pandemic which would affect us all, but affect us unevenly and in some cases, unjustly. We are very thankful that although travel restrictions precluded any visits by First Steps teams to North Korea in 2020, God has preserved the work of First Steps, making it possible for thousands of children, mothers and babies, to receive nutritional support necessary for growth and good health thanks to a good supply of soybeans stocked in the warehouse.

We are profoundly grateful for the continued generosity and prayers of our supporters throughout the pandemic, which have helped to make the work possible.

We are thankful we have been able to maintain contact with our partners in the DPRK in the absence of in-person visits, and for our continued communication.

We look forward to seeing them again in person in God’s perfect timing.

In early 2020, our North Korean partners undertook the distribution of the remaining 100 tonnes of soybeans which had been kept in storage from the November 2019 shipment. In May 2020, 40 metric tonnes of soybeans were shipped and in July 2020, 7.2 million sachets of micronutrient Sprinkles were shipped. These two shipments, have, however, been held up in Dalian, China due to the closed border. We have been assured that when that upon the reopening of the border, our shipment will be given priority in terms of passage.

We have also purchased an additional 200 tonnes of soybeans, which are to be shipped at a future date.

We miss our quarterly visits to North Korea, which give us the opportunity to see firsthand what is happening at the local level, and to ensure that

production and distribution operations are running smoothly. Generally, the North Korean grown supply of soybeans would last from around the end of November until April, after which, First Steps soybeans would be their mainstay.

First Steps staff and volunteers have been at work throughout 2020, creating a new database in the Office. This is an extensive undertaking, which will likely continue well into 2021. We are excited at the prospect of increased efficiency and greater potential, which the new database will make possible

As we reflect on the experiences of 2020, we are reminded that even when the storm of the pandemic may be raging around the world, God is still sovereign and only He can calm the waters.

2021 Outlook

Our office in Vancouver is a place where staff, volunteers, and supporters, come together to work, pray, and plan.

Our work has certainly looked different this year. Several of us are working remotely and we have grown accustomed to wearing masks. Despite the changes, we remain resolute in our mission, inspired by the compassion of our supporters.



1. Our current focus is on:
2. Acquiring the relevant permits to ship soybeans, Sprinkles, food processing systems, and relief goods.
3. Affirming our North Korean friends of our continued support and discuss plans for our next visit once the borders reopen.
4. Expanding our existing programs abroad and developing our local systems.



Despite global uncertainty, we do not lose heart rather, we affirm our faith in His perfect timing.

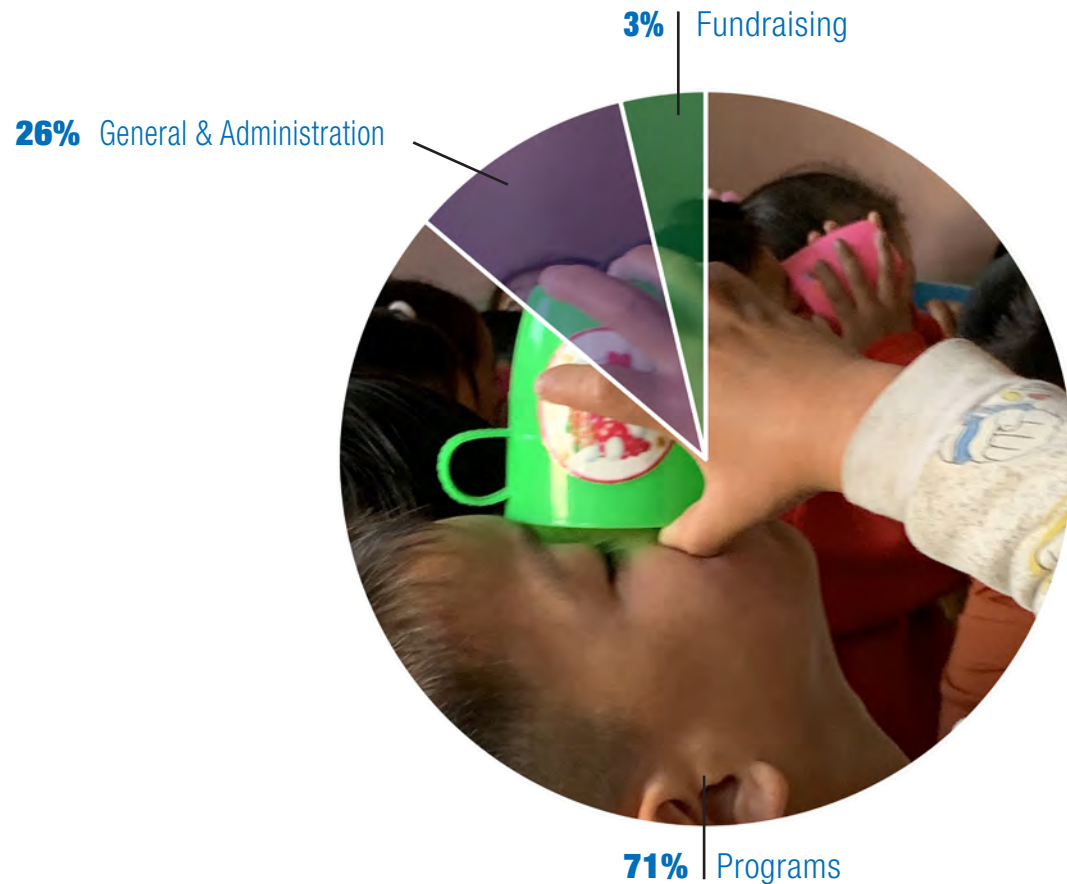

2020 FINANCES

As border closures have hindered First Steps' program operations this year, the program expenses for 2020 are lower than anticipated. Consequently, administration and fundraising expenses assume an atypically high percentage of total spending, whilst consistent in real terms in regard to typical spending patterns. The regular margin for First Steps' general administration is 17%.

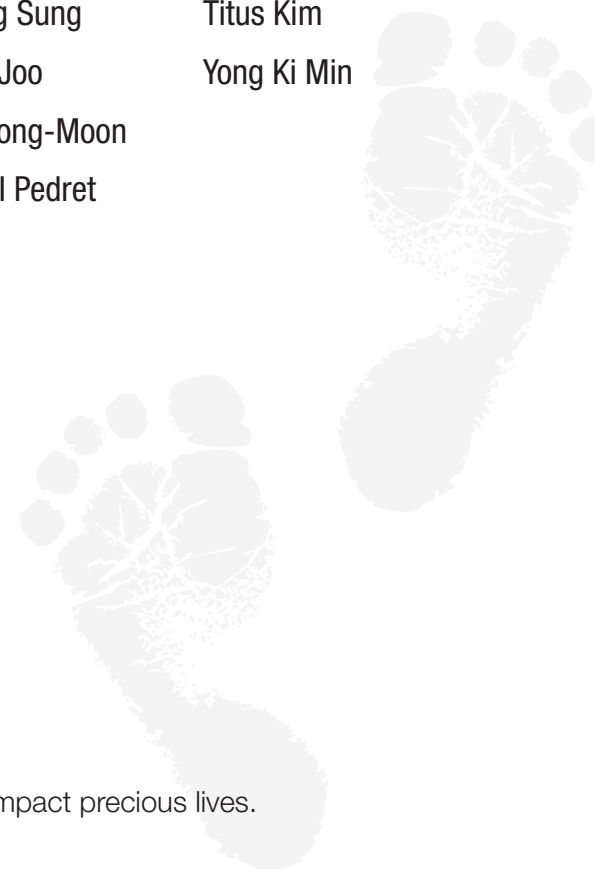
